

**Southern Research Station webinars** cover a wide range of topics, including the Southern Forest Futures Project ([www.srs.fs.usda.gov/futures](http://www.srs.fs.usda.gov/futures)), invasive plants, southern pine beetle, timber tax update, climate change, and silvopasture. Collaborating with the U.S. Forest Service Southern Region, Southern Regional Extension Forestry, North Carolina State University, Texas AgriLife Extension, USDA Natural Resources Conservation Service, and North Carolina State University, we joined with university, government, and nongovernmental organizations to reach hundreds of stakeholders.

Webinar participants include policymakers; Federal, State, and private natural resource and conservation specialists; master gardeners; industry and conservation leaders; and landowners. Webinars enable participants to reduce travel time, fuel costs, and carbon footprints.
